HISTORY OF PROGRAM

Several years ago, Murray County Commissioner Dave Thiner attended a meeting regarding an Internship Program that had been started in a neighboring county. Liking the idea of bringing a similar program to his own county, Thiner brought the idea to the County Administrator.

At the time, funding for the program was not possible, but when Murray County received American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, Thiner again brought up the program, noting that Nobles County used the ARPA funding mechanism for interns.

The Murray County ARPA Committee and then the County Commissioners dedicated \$115,000 toward an Internship Program, partnering with the Southwest Minnesota Private Industry Council. The funds will be used for 15 internship positions over a 3-year period.

SWMNPIC worked with the Murray County Economic Development Authority to get students and businesses matched and were able to place 7 college students in Murray County jobs in the first year of the program. There were no geographical restraints to where the students could come from – only that the businesses where they were placed had to be located in Murray County.

Murray County is pleased with the results of the first year of the program and looking forward to more students participating in 2025.
